Pastor David's Weekly Devotional

Years ago, I was hunting with a good friend. One of us is an avid, experienced and expert hunter; and I am the other one. One day, as we hiked through the fallen snow-covered timber and steep frozen hills of our expedition, we spotted a beautiful elk. She was just out of my range, so my hunting partner motioned for me to follow him and whispered, "Walk fast, but be quiet." I whispered back, "I can do one or the other, but not both!" Perhaps needless to say, we didn't get the elk.

Walk fast but be quiet. That resembles many of the spiritual challenges Christians face. For example, we are called to work hard but let God work through us, to be meek but not weak, to study God's Word faithfully but be in prayer constantly, to be courageous but gracious, to be in the world but not of the world, to fear God but not be afraid of God, to serve the Lord but with joy and gladness, and to be spiritually discerning but not critically minded.

That last one has recently grabbed my attention: we are called to be spiritually discerning, but not critically minded. That is, Christians are to possess a shrewd humility. When Jesus sent out the Twelve, He said, "Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves" (Matt.10:16). We need to judge wisely, but not be judgmental. We need to think critically, but not act hypocritically. We need to be discerning, but not condemning. We need to be willing and able to correct error and admonish the sinner, but not be hypercritical or enamored with fault-finding. In addition, we must be willing and able to receive correction and instruction from other Christians.

Like Christ, the apostle Paul exhorted believers to be both innocent and discerning: "Brothers, do not be children in your thinking. Be infants in evil, but in your thinking be mature" (1Cor.14:20). "... try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them" (Eph.5:10-11). "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is" (Eph.5:15-17).

C.S. Lewis, in his profound book *The Screwtape Letters*, provides us with some much-needed wisdom [note: this book is written from the perspective of a senior demon giving advice to a subordinate demon, so here the "Enemy" refers to God]. "Surely you know that if a man can't be cured of churchgoing, the next best thing is to send him all over the neighbourhood looking for the church that 'suits' him until he becomes a taster or connoisseur of churches. . . . The search for a 'suitable' church makes the man a critic where the Enemy wants him to be a pupil."

Unfortunately, many Christians today look less like Peter and Paul, and more like Statler and Waldorf (the "two old guys" on The Muppets who sat on the balcony always criticizing and rarely participating). Our consumer-driven culture has paved the way for many Christians to be hecklers and critics of churches rather than students and servants in church. Striving to be sacrificial and servant-minded certainly swims against the current of our more self-centered and self-serving society. But that is exactly what we are to do as we follow our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who "came not to be served but to serve" (Mk.10:45).

"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into His presence with singing!" (Psalm 100:1-2).
